Year in Review

2022 was another low-activity year for Fertile Ground. Our board members have continued their work on community issues, racial injustice, poverty, indigenous sovereignty, and environmental and women's issues. We have continued to fiscally sponsor other organizations through our fiscal sponsorship program, including the Mountains and Waters Alliance and the Rural Watch Africa Initiative (RUWAI). We are also continuing our support of Viveros Farm, a non-profit community oriented urban aquaponics, composting, and sustainability collective in the Bay Area, which was awarded a \$278,531.10 grant from the USDA in August to establish long-term, affordable nutritious food options for The City of East Palo Alto (EPA) residents.
